Writing:

Through the story of the Secret Diary of Jane Pinny, the children will learn about Victorian life and use this as inspiration for our first block of writing.

They shall then write a biography about Queen Elizabeth I and Queen Victoria before finishing the year with poetry using the senses.

Computing:

The final unit is about word processing. The children learn essential word processing skills, including typing, formatting text, inserting images, saving and retrieving their work.

Art:

The children will learn a variety of techniques using clay sculpture. They shall learn to make marks in clay and make a pinch pot before learning about making relief tiles designed to have an appearance like a house.

PE:

On Mondays, the children have team building activities with Mr Troman and Mr Evans.

On Thursdays, the children have athletics with Mr Evans and Coach Dom or Chloe.

MFL:

The children will continue to practise their growing vocabulary and add to this by learning some French adjectives.

Reading:

The class read daily during their phonics lessons. They also read once a week with an adult in school.

In addition to this, we maximise every opportunity for shared reading in lessons and share and discuss whole class texts.

PSHCE:

In our new topic of 'Changing Me', the children consider the natural process of changing from young to old and the milestones they will encounter along the way. As the end of term approaches, they prepare themselves for changes next year.

RE:

During this term, the children will be learning about the religion of Islam. The unit of study is called 'Who is Muslim and how do they live?' Having already learnt about Islam, the children will now further their studies.

Christian Ethos:

'Respect' is the core value that we are learning about this term. The children have daily worships in which we share Bible stories and sing praises.

Mathematics:

The children learn how to tell the time, initially using o'clock and half past and then moving on to quarter to, quarter past and minutes past the hour.

We measure in grams and kg for mass and ml and l for capacity before looking at how we measure temperature.

Finally the last module focuses on describing movement and turns, including those made in shape patterns.

History:

The children make comparisons between two queens: Elizabeth I and Victoria. They shall learn about each and then compare their reign. We shall learn why they are both significant monarchs and what this word means.

Music:

This half term, the children will learn more about composers and will consolidate their learning of the songs learnt this year. Children will compose, sing and play instruments.

Science:

The topic of 'Materials' continues. The children consider the properties of different materials and why this makes them suitable for different purposes.
