Writing:
Children will read and learn about writing stories set in fantasy worlds. This will then be followed by being taught techniques and etiquette for standard newspaper reports. Finally, children will spend time studying and implementing features and techniques associated with limericks, riddles and humorous poems. Children will also learn supporting aspects of spelling, punctuation and grammar.

Computing:
Children will be taught to select, use and combine a variety of software (including internet services) on a range of digital devices to design and create a range of content that combine text, images, sound and video.

Music:
This term we will be learning The Blackbird song by The Beatles. We will also learn how to support the song with an accompaniment instrument.

PE:
This half-term, children will spend time learning skills and techniques for playing netball and hockey.

Modern Foreign Languages:
This half-term, children will continue to broaden their descriptive vocabulary and learn how to apply this in different contexts. Children will also develop their language detective skills.

Reading:
Reading will be supported through regular child-teacher reading and through whole class teaching. There will be a focus on learning comprehension skills as well as decoding. The children will continue to use the Accelerated Reader programme.



PSHCE:
This half-term's PSHCE learning will be based around relationships. Children will explore different types of relationships and consider how conflicts can be resolved.

RE:
The learning for this half-term will centre around the question: "For Christians, what is the impact of Pentecost?"

Science:
This half-term, we will be learning about living things and their habitats. Children will learn how to classify and group a variety of living things. We will look at the different environments, how they can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.

Mathematics:
The children will begin the half-term learning about mass and capacity. Following this unit of work, the children will start working with decimal numbers and return to measurement to develop upon the skills learnt earlier in the year.

Geography:
This half-term, the children will learn about mountains, hills and coasts. We will learn about the different types of mountains and how they are formed.

Design Technology:
This term, we are looking at seasonal food and drink. We will learn to prepare and cook a variety of predominantly savoury dishes using a range of cooking techniques.

Christian Ethos:
This term there will be a focus on Love. This will be emphasised both in terms of learning attitudes and in non-academic situations.

Extra Curricular Learning:
This half-term there will be access to after school clubs, including sports, curriculum based activities and Forest School.
