Writing:

Climate Change



PSHCE:

First, we will be learning about how to improve our mental health and then moving on how to be positive online.

RE:

We will be exploring the question, 'What do religious/ non-religious worldviews teach about caring for the Earth?'. We will learn about festivals related to the Earth and how people show respect to nature.

Christian Ethos:

This term there will be a focus on our Christian Core Value of love. This will be emphasised both in terms of learning attitudes and in non-academic situations.

Mathematics:

This term, we will be returning to a range of maths topics including: area and perimeter, statistics and algebra. We will also continue learning about position and direction. This involves plotting points on a grid and being able to translate those coordinates.

We shall continue with our weekly online maths homework, which is set on a Monday.

Geography:

We shall learn the 8 cardinal and intercardinal compass points and use them to give directions. We will also learn how 4-figure and 6-figure grid references work on maps and how to read Ordnance Survey map symbols. We shall then test our knowledge with some orienteering on the field.

Music:

The unit for this half term is called 'Music and Me'. Pupils will consider the various elements that shape us with reference to social and cultural differences.

Science:

We will be learning about climate change this term. We will consider the possible effects and how we can help look after our world.
