Writing:

Children will revisit, consolidate and develop writing skills from the previous academic year. In particular, learning will focus on fictional adventure narratives, recounts and poetry using imagery. Children will also learn about the implementation of various grammatical features.

Reading:

Reading will be supported both through: the school-wide strategy, centering on a phonics-led approach; and through the class-based approach including regular child-teaching reading and incorporating the accelerated reader programme.

Mathematics:

Number and place value is the first area that will be consolidated upon and then developed within this half-term. Leading on from this will be consolidation, followed by development of children's skills, abilities and reasoning relating to addition and subtraction.

Computing:

As well as learning and implementing practical, real-world computing skills, children will also learn the importance of and strategies for being safe online.

Art & Design:

The focus will be on art and design skills and their implementation. There will be a mix of learning about artists and techniques, combined with practical elements.

PE:

Within PE lessons this half-term, the children will develop their skills in Tag Rugby and Yoga.

Modern Foreign Languages:

This half-term, French lessons will focus on revising and consolidating knowledge around common vocabulary and linguistic structures, including topics such as number and places.



PSHCE:

This half-term will ask children to engage in introspective reflection and consider the implications of different actions for themselves and others.

RE:

This half-term's learning will be focussed around the creation story and what Christians can learn from it. There will be an opportunity for discussions and presentation of opinions.

Christian Ethos:

Friendship is the common theme that will be considered this half-term and will a topic regularly discussed across the curriculum.

Geography:

Cities and counties of the UK will be the area of learning. Children will work with paper and virtual maps and have an opportunity to develop research and presentation skills.

Music:

The learning for this half-term is focussed around 'Let Your Spirit Fly', a children's R&B song, and will include themes around the dimensions of music as well as singing and playing instruments.

Science:

The learning will focus on rocks and include topics from formation to uses in our world. Children will also be encouraged to develop their scientific thinking in areas such as observation, recording and concluding.
